

I SPY Answers from the Quiz in the March 2021 Parish Newsletter

1. The sign commemorating the bridge over Beverley Brook.



2. St John the Baptist Church was built at the top of Kingston Hill in Kingston Vale in 1861, a small church with picturesque bellcote, at that time surrounded largely by fields. Due to the proximity to White Lodge in Richmond Park the church had many connections with the royal family and it was here that the future George V's engagement to Mary of Teck was witness. The Duchess of Teck, laid the **foundation stone** for the North aisle.



3. **'The Way'** St Paul's Cathedral Tercentenary Gates are located on the edge of Sidmouth Woods in Richmond Park.



4. A rare and historic milestone and **mounting block** thought to date from 1654 has been restored and put back in its original location in Roehampton Vale. A mounting block is a block of stone used by riders to mount a horse and the Roehampton block is combined with an inscription reading 'From London Towne to Portsdown they say tis myls three score.'



5. **Telephone Box** not in use, near the Robin Hood Lane Bus Stop on Kingston Vale (A308).



6. *Correction, this question should have read Tributary to the Thames*

The Thames Tributary the Beverley flows northwards to the Thames. The Beverley runs through Wimbledon Common and Richmond Park. Post to the north Roehampton Vale, Post to the south Coombe.

7. The **London Cornish RFC** is a rugby union club which was originally formed for **Cornish exiles** in London. It was established in 1962 by a group who met in Fleet Street 's Cock Tavern, and were originally known as the "Cornish Exiles". The club changed its name to "London Cornish" shortly thereafter and played occasional fixtures in a variety of locations until moving to the current ground, the Richardson Evans Memorial Playing Fields on Wimbledon Common, just off the A3.



8. **Plaque unveiled by David Mellor MP** is at Asda.



9. **Sewer vent**, at Robin Hood Roundabout.



10. **Huf House**, Ullswater Close.

11. **Pegasus Crossing**—Thousands of pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders benefit from the crossing connecting Richmond Park and Wimbledon Common.



12. **The London Football training ground sign** is for Colliers Wood United who play their home games at Wibbandune Sports Ground, A3 Southbound, opposite 199–213 Robin Hood Way, Wimbledon, SW20 0AA. The ground has a 102-seater covered stand.
